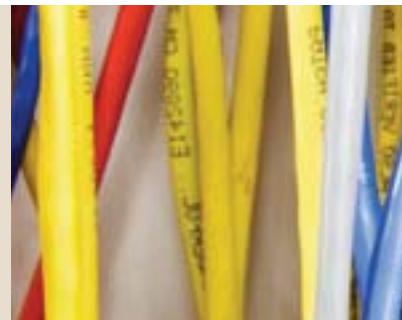

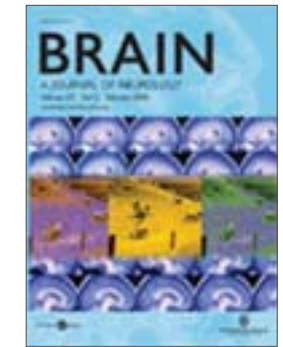

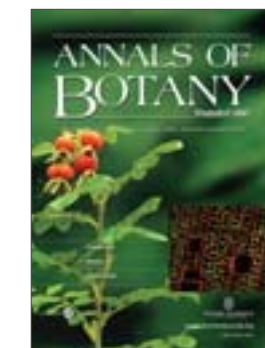

WHAT IS THE POLICY ON PERPETUAL ACCESS TO OXFORD JOURNALS ARCHIVE CONTENT?

Outright purchase of the Oxford Journals Archive will ensure that your institution has perpetual access to the full text of all titles included in the archive for the year you purchased the product. Lapsed subscribers to the Oxford Journals Archive do not have perpetual access rights, and will therefore lose access to all content in the archive if they choose not to renew their subscription. Purchasers should note that 19 titles have been added to the archive since it was originally launched in 2006. Customers who purchased the archive during 2006, 2007 or 2008 can choose to pay a top-up fee to ensure that they have access to all titles in the 2009 version of the Oxford Journals Archive.
